## (b) Councillor's Reports

Cllr Hosking was not present but provided the following report for publication with the minutes:

National Report on 20 mph zones has been published and DCC are reviewing their policy.

#### Budget

It is proposed that the County Council precept will increase by 3.99% this year to enable a balanced budget. The County is still running a deficit this year of about £4 million, though we anticipate that we will be able to make savings to meet this shortfall by the year end.

Pressures on the budget going forward include additional demand for Statutory Services, particularly Children's Services where there has been a significant increase in Education, Health & Care Plans (EHCPs) and the cost of placements for children in care. DCC policy is emphasising early intervention to try and keep families together and reduce the number of children going into care.

Budget details will be confirmed next month.

### Street Lighting

The installation of LED street lighting has produced encouraging savings and we will continue to roll this out across the County to the extent that our capital budget allows.

### Cllr Holway

Joint Local Plan adoption due in March.

South West Mutual Bank for local businesses is still being developed.

Peer Review has recently taken place - various suggestions to be assessed.

Budget consultation is now available on the SHDC website.

SHDC have written to the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government to urge the Government to close a tax loophole which allows second homeowners to avoid paying any tax on their properties. Currently, owners of second homes can decide whether to register their properties for council tax or business rates. To qualify for business rates, the property must be available for let for a minimum of 140 days per year. If registered for business rates, the owners of the properties can then apply for Small Business Rate Relief, and in most cases, this removes the charge completely.

Local Elections for all Borough Council and Town and Parish Council seats will be taking place on Thursday 2 May 2019.

Parish Councillors were reminded that any queries/concerns sent to Cllr Holway should be copied to the Clerk and Chairman.

Various complaints have been received in connection with the brightness of the exterior lights at "Ermington House", when approaching the property from the Ugborough direction, and they remain switched on during the night. This is a Highways issue to be raised with Cllr Hosking. **ACTION: Clerk** 

£500 Locality Fund – agreed to purchase bench(es) for Ermington play park. Clerk to contact Ugborough's Parish Clerk to ascertain where they had purchased their recycled benches. **ACTION: Clerk**

Cllr Onley asked Cllr Holway whether or not any deviation from the covenant could be covered by indemnity insurance and asked if SHDC legal department could advise on this. ACTION: Cllr Holway

79/18 Crooked Spire ACV - ongoing. ACTION: Cllr Martin

79/18 Trial scheme to restrict the width of the road near "The First and Last" to see if it would slow down traffic is being drafted. ACTION: Cllr Hosking/Nick Colton

79/18 Repairs to Erme bridge. DCC Highways advised and is in the list of bridges to be inspected. ACTION: CIIr Hosking

79/18 Blocked drains on the left-hand side of Town Hill. A grate to be removed to assess the situation. A rota of drain cleaning is ongoing. DCC are proposing to be smart with their drain cleaning and possibly adjust visits based on blockage in gulley rather than same sequence for all. #### 97/18 FINANCE

**Precept 2019/2020** – Councillors discussed the Draft Budget and Explanatory Note. Both documents are attached to these minutes for reference and had been circulated in advance of the meeting. The documents formed the basis of a discussion and decision on Ermington Parish Council's Precept for the forthcoming financial year. The Explanatory Note had set out the following options:

- 1. No increase
- 2. Increase by 3.39%
- 3. Increase by 4.37%, or
- 4. Increase by 5.35%

Councillor Onley proposed a further option of reducing the Precept by 5% to reflect the new circumstances the Parish Council was facing as the stated reason for the previous years increase was to finance the new village hall, but this project was now 'on hold', and the timescale for needing to spend money raised for the project had already slipped by at least twelve months. The proposal was seconded by Councillor Allis. Cllr Kerslake responded by pointing out that expenditure would still be required on the project during the next year as reflected in the Draft Budget.

Councillors considered the options and a majority of Councillors voted to increase rather than decrease the Precept and Option 3 was selected which would provide an income of £27000 for 2019/20.

Members of the public had been invited to comment or ask questions on the Budget and Precept during the public questions section of the meeting but no questions or comments had been forthcoming.

Campaign to Protect Rural England (CPRE) - membership was discussed and it was agreed not to pursue.

### Ermington Parish Council Draft Budget 2019/20 - Explanatory Note

The enclosed spreadsheet shows the draft budget for 2019/20. The actual spend and income against the budget for the current period (2018/19) will not be known until April this year but spend and income for the period ending 31 January 2019 (Column 2) has been used as the basis for estimating expenditure for 2019/20 as set out in the final column. Estimates also take into account a degree of inflation at a rate of 3%.

## Running Costs (Sections 1-3)

A significant item of expenditure that was not anticipated when drawing up the 2018/19 budget was the cost of parish elections. The normal procedure for filling casual vacancies is to advertise them, meet applicants and co-opt those candidates felt by councillors to be suitable. If however a number of parishioners request that an election be held to fill a vacancy there is a statutory requirement to hold one. This is organised by South Hams District Council who invoice the Parish Council for its costs. In the financial year 2018/19 three vacancies arose and as a result of requests for an election two elections were held. One to fill two vacancies and another to fill one. This added a total sum of £ £4345 to our budgeted costs. All councillors will be required to stand for re-election in May 2019. The Parish Council will, however, be invoiced for the cost of that in FY 2020/21 but on the basis of previous experience it is sensible to assume that during the FY 2019/20 further vacancies will arise which will not be filled by cooption. A provision of £4500 in the Budget has therefore been made for that possibility.

Anticipated costs relating to the insurance and maintenance of the public open space below "The Spires" included in the 2019/20 budget now no longer arise following the decision by the Parish Council not to take the land over. If the Parish Council's plans to build a village hall on Ermington Playing Field proceed the field will need to be purchased from South Hams District Council (SHDC) for £1. The agreement with SHDC would require SHDC to continue ground maintenance including grass cutting for a period of two years. SHDC would also continue inspection and insurance of the play equipment during the same period. The Parish Council would however be responsible for obtaining and paying for public liability insurance on the land, other than the play area. Liability would also arise for any work to the boundaries, play equipment, hedges, railings, gates, benching and so on. A figure of £750 has been included for these costs.

Grass cutting for Honey's field assumes that the Parish Council fund this subject to the agreement of the landowner.

## **Community Grants (Section 4)**

The Parish Council routinely supports expenditure for the Churchyard (£1200) and the same figure is included in the 2019/20 budget. Also the annual fireworks display (£500). The latter figure is included in the figure for miscellaneous

donations for 2019/20. The defibrillator figure of £1702 for the current period relates to a payment to the Community Heartbeat Trust for the defibrillator and sentry box amounting to £1575 plus a maintenance charge of £127. The £1575 figure was covered by a grant in 2016. Expenditure for 2019/20 relates to maintenance of the equipment only.

# Village Hall Project (Section 6)

Financial planning for this project and allocating expenditure to specific timescales has proved to be difficult due to unforeseen circumstances. The project is currently on hold pending a decision from Devon County Council in response to an application by the Friends of Ermington Park Group that the recreation ground be designated as a Village Green under The Commons Act 2006. If the application is successful the Parish Council will be forced to abandon its plans to build a village hall on that site. If, however, the application fails and there is no other impediment to the project the Parish Council will continue with its plans. This will involve costs during the 2019/20 period as outlined in the Budget. The professional/planning fees relate to the planning fee plus the need for input from professionals to prepare planning support documents. Also the cost of a professional to prepare the submission for planning on behalf of the Parish Council and undertake follow up discussions following the planners' response.

#### Reserves

The annual accounts for 2017/2018 show cash assets less liabilities in excess of £90000. The Parish Council maintains a General Reserve of £10000 and the remaining £80000 had been placed in the earmarked reserves for the Village Hall Project. The earmarked figure includes £20000 Section 106 money received in 2013/14. The outturn for 2018/19 is expected to show a surplus as a result of underspend on delayed items under Land Running Costs (Section 3) and Fees (Section 6) but partly offset by unanticipated costs for elections (Section 2)

### Precept 2019/20

The current Precept is £25299 plus support Grant of £426 making a total of £25725. Grant Support for 2019 has been slightly reduced to £384. The Parish Council is invited to decide on the Precept for 2019/20. Suggested options are as follows:

- 1. No increase provides income of £25885 =  $\pm$ 160 over 2018/19
- 2. 3.39% increase provides £26750 =  $\pm$ £1025 over 2018/19 which increases a Band D property cost by 4.4p per week
- 3. 4.37% increase provides £27000 =  $\pm$ £1275 over 2018/19 which increases a Band D property cost by 5.67p per week
- 4. 5.35% increase provides £27250 =  $\pm$ £1525 over 2018/19 which increases a Band D property cost by 6.94p per week.

The total Budget for 2019/20 is £37040

The impact of Options 1 to 4 above would result in the following estimated financial outcomes to the 2019/20 Budget:

Option 1: Deficit of £9300 Option 2: Deficit of £8435 Option 3: Deficit of £8185 Option 4: Deficit of £7935

On the basis of the anticipated surplus for 2018/19 it is reasonable to assume that around £10000 can be added to the earmarked funds for the village hall. Overspend of between £7935 to £9300 in 2019/20 as a result of village hall expenditure would justify using the village hall earmarked reserves.
